1. Speech is important


20-30% of the book of Proverbs relates in some way to speech

The words of the reckless pierce like swords, but the tongue of the wise brings healing' 12.18




to bless and bring life

'Anxiety weighs down the heart, but a kind word cheers it up' 12.25




to heal

The lips of fools bring them strife, and their mouths invite a beating.






Truth – is it true?

What is the tone of what we are saying?




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
Is what we are saying necessary?

- 'Sin is not ended by multiplying words, but the prudent hold their tongues.' 10.19




Is what we are saying necessary?
